Last Monday 2J, along with the rest of Year 2, attended an excursion at The Australian Botanic Gardens in Mount Annan. Students had a chance to find and collect bugs (and safely release them, of course!), investigate the lake, search for eggs, create their own creatures, visit the rain forest, identify native plants, and battle the mosquitoes.

2J had a fantastic time, and their new love of bugs tells us that was their favourite part!

Kindergarten Requirements for 2021

1 x Labelled Home reading folder (A4 plastic envelope)
1x Labelled Library Bag
1x Labelled Headphones (over the head style)
1x Labelled Paint shirt
4 x Glue Sticks (wind up)
6 x Whiteboard Markers
2x Tissues Boxes
1x Paper Towel roll
1x Soap / Hand sanitizer on tap



Stage One Requirements

Roll up Glue Sticks x 4 Whiteboard markers x 6 A whiteboard rubber (an old sock will do) Home Reading A4 Plastic Folder/Envelope Homework Book A4 size Library bag Paint Shirt Headphones (Over the ear type) Tissues Hand Sanitiser/ Soap on Tap Paper Towel and/or wipes



A pencil case containing the following clearly labelled stock: 4 HB pencils 1 eraser 1 sharpener that will catch the shavings 1 30cm ruler (not metal or flexi) 1 pair of scissors 3 glue sticks Coloured pencils NO liquid paper (including no liquid paper tape) 1 Homework book A4 size 6 white board markers 1 white board eraser 1 paint shirt (an old large sized t-shirt that covers the clothing is fine.) 2 fine point black sharpies for art For communal close use:

For communal class use: 2 large boxes of tissues 2 bottles Hand Sanitiser 2 rolls paper towels 1 liquid soap or 1 packet of wipes.

Students may bring textas to school but these will not be used very often so please have them in a separate pencil case.

As Year 4 students gain their pen licenses throughout the year they will require red and blue fine point pens.
